SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

This bill amends Section 30-6-1, NMSA 1978 to include the word “fentanyl” alongside “methamphetamine” to section J. This addition would make knowing and intentional exposure of a child to fentanyl prima facie evidence of child abuse.

This bill proposes to appropriate \$500,000 from the general fund to the Department of Public Safety to expand investigations of child abuse and neglect cases to include those involving fentanyl. At the end of FY25, any leftover money would revert to the general fund.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Considering the bill’s proposed appropriation to DPS to further investigate child abuse relating to fentanyl, there are no additional fiscal implications to DPS.
