BILL SUMMARY

This memorial acknowledges administrative burdens faced by behavioral health care providers statewide. It requires the interagency behavioral health purchasing collaborative to lead a study across state departments to examine administrative burdens and to provide recommendations to expand the behavioral health care workforce in New Mexico by November 1, 2024.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None identified for CYFD. If enacted, CYFD Behavioral Health Services (BHS) leadership would continue existing efforts to address provider workforce development and related administrative issues.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

CYFD’s participation in the proposed study of administrative burdens faced by behavioral health providers in New Mexico will further support BHS in aligning recommendations internally and with other state agencies. Recommendations of the proposed taskforce would need to be reviewed for alignment with state regulations.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

None anticipated. CYFD Behavioral Health Services leadership currently participates in the Behavioral Health Collaborative strategic plan related to behavioral health provider workforce development. BHS leadership also participates in other related workforce development efforts with the Health Care Authority (HCA) Medical Assistance Division (MAD) and Behavioral Health Services Division (BHSD), such as interagency Clinical Policy meetings, to address state policy and procedures and billing requirements.
