**BILL SUMMARY**

Synopsis: Amends the Cybersecurity Act to Provide for rulemaking, establishing reporting requirements for public entities receiving State Appropriations. Makes changes to the membership of the Cybersecurity Advisory Committee.

**FISCAL IMPLICATIONS**

None to IAD

**SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

According to the Act minimum security standards and policies shall be “applicable to entities receiving general fund appropriations and persons or entities transacting business with the State.” Also Stated in the Act amendments “The rules shall include a requirement that entities receiving general fund appropriations from the legislature shall report to the Cybersecurity Office all information Technology and Cybersecurity expenditures in a form and manner established by the Cybersecurity Office.”

This language could imply that as recipients of Appropriations or entities transacting business with the State, NM Nations Tribes and Pueblos (NPTs) could be subject to reporting and minimum Security requirements as established by Cybersecurity office (DoIT).

**PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS**

Possible Reporting and/or IT/Security measures for NPTs.

IAD Secretary is responsible for appointing one member to the Cybersecurity Advisory Committee.
