BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

The SHPAC amendment to SB 204, which would create the offense of unlawful carrying of a firearm in a park or playground, adds concealed carry licensees and federal firearms licensees to the bill’s list of exceptions.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Unlike the New Mexico concealed carry license, the federal firearms license is intended for individuals involved in the dealing or manufacture of firearms and does not require any firearm safety training or demonstration of proficiency using firearms.
