BILL SUMMARY

Original Synopsis:

SB 137 amends Section 63-9D-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, Chapter 25, Section 3, as amended) to read as the 911 Bond Act.

SB 137 proposes a renaming and expansion of the Enhanced 911 Act by proposing an increase in the surcharge, expansions of the technologies that may be deployed to provide the service, and an expansion of the parties that can be reimbursed for providing these services.

Specifically, SB 137 is directed to further the public interest and protect the safety, health, and welfare of the people of New Mexico by enabling the operation of a 911 emergency reporting systems, including next-Gen 911, and advanced 911 technologies by invoking an increase in the 911 surcharge, updating the uses of the 911 surcharge, and expanding grant funding.

Senate Tax, Business & Transportation Committee Amendment

The Amendment makes one change to the original bill – decreasing the surcharge from \$1.50 to \$1.00.
