SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> This amended Bill amends the contribution percentages for state employee health benefits and authorizes the Cabinet Secretary of the Health Care Authority to use health care affordability funds to reduce or eliminate premiums paid by certain government employees. As proposed in the Bill, effective July 1, 2025, contributions for group health insurance for the state or executive, judicial, or legislative departments, including agencies, boards, or commissions, would pay eighty percent. The Secretary of Health Care Authority would make health benefit premiums more affordable using appropriations from the health care affordability fund to now include covering a portion or all of net premiums for: 1) state employees who do not qualify for Medicaid and have a modified adjusted gross income up to two hundred fifty percent of the federal poverty level; 2) members of the New Mexico National Guard who qualify for federal Tricare reserve select policy. In addition, the Bill would include if a state agency responsible for providing state employee health benefits under the Health Care Purchasing Act establishes a reference-based pricing program for in-network and out-of-network hospital services to have set maximum amounts as established by the Secretary of Health Care Authority.

SFC Substitute in Context -03/10/25 – modifying language as follows:

Section 1. - O. By July 1, 2026, the health care authority shall ensure that state employees are provided the opportunity to purchase a variety of health benefit plans with varying plan designs and cost-sharing options."

Section 2. -B: The purpose of the fund is to cover a portion or all of the net premium health benefit contributions for state employees enrolled in health benefit plans covered by the Health Care Purchasing Act who do not qualify for Medicaid and:

(a) have a modified adjusted gross income up to two hundred fifty percent of the federal poverty level; or

(b) purchase employee-only coverage and receive an annual salary from the state of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or less".
