#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Senate Bill SB384 appropriates one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) from the general fund to the New Mexico Department of Agriculture ("Department") in fiscal year 2026 to plan, develop, and create a Rio Hondo watershed district. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2026 would revert to the general fund.

## The amendment clarifies that this appropriation is for the Rio Hondo in Taos County.

## SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Developing a watershed district would allow the Department to plan for preventing and mitigating water-related issues, such as flooding, erosion, and water quality degradation, and to implement projects such as drainage systems, wetland restoration, and streambank stabilization within its boundaries. The existence of a watershed district could also further the Department's ability to engage in regional water planning for the Rio Hondo area.
