1. BILL SUMMARY

SB510 amends definitions in the Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities Code and the Assisted Outpatient Treatment Act.

SB 510 strikes language defining "harm to others" and "harm to self" and replaces with the following:

N. "harm to others" means that within the recent past, the person has inflicted or attempted to inflict serious bodily harm on another or has acted in such a way as to create a substantial risk of serious bodily harm to another and it is more likely than not that the conduct will be repeated in the near future;

O. "harm to self" means that:

(1) it is more likely than not that in the

near future the person will attempt to commit suicide or will cause serious bodily harm to the person's self by violent or other self-destructive means; or

(2) the person's recent behavior:

(a) demonstrates that the person lacks

the capacity to satisfy the person's need for nourishment, personal or medical care, shelter or self-protection and safety and that it is more likely than not that the lack of capacity will result in death, serious bodily injury or serious physical or mental debilitation in the near future if treatment is not ordered; and (b) makes it more likely than not that the person will suffer serious physical debilitation in the near future unless adequate treatment is provided pursuant to the Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities Code;

- b) <u>Significant Issues</u>
- SB510 is an improvement upon other iterations of the proposed changes to "harm to self" and "harm to others" introduced this session. Importantly, "harm to others" contemplates threats, in addition to assaults and batteries. Without inclusion of threats, a person would have to actually harm someone to be considered for commitment, which creates problems for healthcare workers. If a person were exhibiting extremely threatening behavior and vocally expressing threats in an emergency room or hospital, staff would have to wait until someone was physically assaulted before utilizing this as an intervention.
- "Harm to self" importantly includes reference to suicide, which was notably struck from other bills attempting to amend these definitions. Suicide is perhaps the most clear qualifier of "harm to self" and the inclusion of this language is critical.
