"61-17A-22. EXEMPTIONS.--The following persons are exempt from the provisions of the Barbers and Cosmetologists Act while in the discharge of their professional duties:

A. persons licensed by the law of this state to practice medicine and surgery or chiropractic;

B. commissioned medical or surgical officers of the United States army, navy STBTC→or←STBTC STBTC→,←STBTC marine STBTC→or air force←STBTC hospital service;

C. registered nurses;

D. funeral service practitioners; [and]

E. persons providing only eyebrow-threading

services; <u>and</u>
