[NEW MATERIAL] AGE VERIFICATION REQUIRED.--SECTION 3.

Α. At the time an individual activates a device, a covered manufacturer shall take commercially reasonable and technically feasible steps to:

ask the user or the user's parent or (1)guardian to provide the user's age during account setup;

if a user or the user's parent or guardian (2)does not opt out, enable a feature to provide applications with a digital signal indicating whether the user is under the age of thirteen, thirteen years of age to fifteen years of age,

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sixteen years of age to seventeen years of age or eighteen
 years of age or older through a real-time application
 programming interface; and

(3) provide features that the user's parent or guardian can use to require parental or guardian consent prior to allowing a user under sixteen years of age to download an application from the application store.

B. For devices sold prior to January 1, 2026, covered manufacturers shall take commercially reasonable and technically feasible steps to ensure that the requirements of Subsection A of this section are included in the device's latest operating system and application store versions and updates by default ninety days after the effective date of the Digital Age Verification Act.

C. The department may promulgate rules in accordance with the Digital Age Verification Act to implement the provisions of that act.

SECTION 4. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] ENFORCEMENT.--

A. A violation of the Digital Age Verification Act is an unfair and deceptive trade practice actionable under the Unfair Practices Act.

B. Prior to initiating any action to enforce the Digital Age Verification Act, the department shall provide a covered manufacturer thirty days' written notice identifying the violation of the Digital Age Verification Act that the

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1 department alleges has been or is being violated. If within 2 the thirty-day period the covered manufacturer cures the 3 noticed violation and provides the department an express 4 written statement that the alleged violation has been cured and that no further violations shall occur, no action shall be initiated against the covered manufacturer for that alleged 7 violation.

If a covered manufacturer continues to violate 8 C. 9 the Digital Age Verification Act following the cure period in Subsection B of this section or breaches an express written 10 statement provided to the department under that subsection, the 11 12 attorney general may initiate an action pursuant to the Unfair Practices Act. 13

SECTION 5. [NEW MATERIAL] INTERIM COMMITTEE STUDY.--The New Mexico legislative council shall require the interim legislative committees that study issues related to science and technology and economic and rural development to:

consult with the department to examine the most Α. effective and feasible method to expand the protections of the Digital Age Verification Act to websites and online services; and

develop legislative proposals for the 2026 Β. legislative session to implement expanded protections based on the committees' findings.

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SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.--

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1	A. The effective date of the provisions of Section
