AN ACT

RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT; ESTABLISHING THE NEW MEXICO-IRELAND TRADE COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

- SECTION 1. [NEW MATERIAL] NEW MEXICO-IRELAND TRADE

 COMMISSION--MEMBERSHIP--DUTIES--ANNUAL REPORT.--
- A. The "New Mexico-Ireland trade commission" is established and administratively attached to the economic development department.
- B. Members of the commission shall be appointed as follows:
- (1) four members who have knowledge of or involvement in organizations that promote Irish affairs or have interest in the well-being of trade relations between New Mexico and Ireland:

(a) one of whom shall be appointed by

- (3) the secretary of economic development or the secretary's designee.
- C. Members of the commission shall serve four-year terms; provided that:
- (1) members initially appointed pursuant to Subparagraphs (a) of Paragraphs (1) and (2) of Subsection B of this section and one of the members appointed pursuant to Subparagraph (e) of Paragraph (2) of Subsection B of this section shall serve an initial term of one year;
- (2) members initially appointed pursuant to Subparagraphs (b) of Paragraphs (1) and (2) of Subsection B of this section and one of the members appointed pursuant to Subparagraph (e) of Paragraph (2) of Subsection B of this section shall serve an initial term of two years;
- (3) members initially appointed pursuant to Subparagraphs (c) of Paragraphs (1) and (2) of Subsection B of this section shall serve an initial term of three years; and
- (4) members initially appointed pursuant to Subparagraphs (d) of Paragraphs (1) and (2) of Subsection B of this section shall serve an initial term of four years.
- D. Appointments shall be made not later than ninety days following the effective date of this 2025 act. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the initial appointment.
- E. Members of the commission who are not public employees are not entitled to per diem and mileage as provided .231771.2

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in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance.

- F. The commission may accept gifts, grants, donations, money from fundraising activities, bequests and other forms of voluntary contributions to carry out the purposes of the commission.
 - G. The commission shall:
- (1) annually elect a chair and vice chair from among the commission's members;
- (2) meet at least once annually and at the call of the chair;
- (3) assign economic development department staff as necessary to carry out the purposes of the commission;
- (4) work to advance bilateral trade and investment between New Mexico and Ireland with emphasis on the technology, agricultural and energy sectors;
- (5) initiate joint action on policy issues of mutual interest between New Mexico and Ireland;
- (6) promote business and academic exchanges between New Mexico and Ireland;
- (7) encourage mutual economic support between New Mexico and Ireland;
- (8) encourage mutual investment in the infrastructure of New Mexico and Ireland; and
 - (9) on or before December 1, 2027 and each

year thereafter, submit to the governor and the legislature a report that includes the commission's findings, results and recommendations.

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2026.

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
