3	WEBSITE LINKS TO THE STATUTORY LANGUAGE THAT CREATES STATE
4	FUNDS IN THE SUNSHINE PORTAL.

6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
7	SECTION 1. Section 10-16D-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010,
8	Chapter 34, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
9	"10-16D-3. SUNSHINE PORTALDEPARTMENT DUTIES
10	A. The department, with the department of finance
11	and administration, shall develop, operate and maintain a
12	single internet website that is free, user-friendly,
13	searchable and accessible to the public, known as the
14	"sunshine portal", to host the state's financial information
15	for the purpose of governmental transparency and
16	accountability to taxpayers.
17	B. No later than October 1, 2010, the department
18	shall create the architecture and the information exchange
19	process for the collection and electronic publication of the
20	state's financial information.
21	C. No later than July 1, 2011, the sunshine portal
22	shall be available for public access and include updated
23	information as required by Subsection D of this section.
24	D. The sunshine portal shall provide, at a
25	minimum, access to the following information:

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1 (1) the state's cash balances by account or 2 fund; 3 (2) a monthly summary of the state's 4 investment accounts; 5 (3) annual operating budgets for each state 6 agency with monthly expenditures by category; (4) contracts that a state agency enters 7 8 into for the lease, sale or development of state land and 9 state contracts that have a total contract price of more than 10 twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), naming the recipient of the contract, the purpose of the contract and the amounts 11 expended. No later than January 1, 2017, the information 12 provided shall also include: 13 (a) the name of the recipient of the 14 15 contract; 16 (b) the purpose of the contract; (c) the amounts expended on the 17 contract; 18 (d) a copy of or an internet website 19 link to a copy of the contract document, including 20 amendments; and 21 a copy of or an internet website 22 (e) link to a copy of a resident certificate issued pursuant to 23 Section 13-1-22 NMSA 1978 and used in the award of a 24 25 contract;

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1 (5) the revenue that the state received in 2 the preceding month by source, such as type of tax, fee, 3 fine, administrative fee or other collection category; 4 special appropriations received outside (6) 5 the general appropriation act by each state agency and the 6 purpose of those appropriations; approved budget adjustment requests by 7 (7) 8 state agency and affected budget category; 9 (8) quarterly consensus revenue estimates; 10 (9) reversions and cash balances by state agency and fund; 11 (10) appropriations for capital projects, 12 identified by project location, type of project and funding 13 source; 14 15 (11) a directory of all employee positions, other than exempt employee positions, identified only by 16 state agency, position title and salary; 17 a directory of all exempt employee (12)18 positions, identified by state agency, position title, salary 19 20 and the name of the individual that holds the position; information relating to local education (13)21 providers compiled and published by the public education 22 department pursuant to Section 10-16D-6 NMSA 1978; 23 (14) a link to an open meeting tracker 24 25 website upon which each state agency shall post open meetings HB 209/a Page 3

1 scheduled for the current month and the next month, including 2 the time and place of the meeting, the subject of the meeting 3 and an agenda; 4 (15) a link to the website maintained by the 5 regulation and licensing department for the purpose of 6 accessing information relating to occupational licenses; a link to the state auditor's website 7 (16) 8 for the purpose of accessing financial audits; 9 (17) a link to New Mexico's statutes; 10 (18) a link to the New Mexico Administrative Code; 11 (19) a link to the secretary of state's 12 website for lobbyist regulation; 13 an annual summary within three months (20) 14 15 after the end of the fiscal year, or as soon thereafter as the information becomes available, of the state's fiscal 16 health, including the state budget, revenues and expenditures 17 for the previous fiscal year and projected revenues and 18 operating budgets for the current fiscal year; 19 20 (21)additional information, as required by rule of the department of finance and administration, that 21 will assist the public in understanding state government 22 operations and the use of taxpayer dollars; and 23 links to the New Mexico compilation 24 (22) 25 commission's website for each state fund created by law that

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3 E. State agencies shall provide updated financial
4 information as frequently as possible but at least monthly.

F. The department shall update the website as new
information is received but at least monthly, include
information from the previous month or year, where relevant,
for comparison purposes and maintain the website as the
primary source of public information about the activity of
the state government."
