SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: Senate Bill 3 changes the authority over vaccine guidance from the federal agency - Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) to New Mexico Department of Health (NMDOH). NMDOH will utilize recommendations for children from the American Academy of Pediatrics and for adult immunizations from American Academy of Family Physicians, American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and American College of Physicians. It adds licensed childcare and licensed early childhood care programs to requiring recommended vaccinations. It prohibits cost-sharing by amending the state insurance code on immunizations recommended by NMDOH.

The bill reaffirms the Statewide Vaccine Purchasing Program, not only allowing the NMDOH to buy vaccines in bulk and manage distribution but recommending rules to establish requirements including frequency of administration.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no Fiscal Implications to the New Mexico Retiree Health Care Authority at this time due to current coverage of recommended vaccines. If NMDOH were to recommend more vaccines that the federal government standards the there could be an increase cost to RHCA in having to absorb additional vaccine costs. Future costs in indeterminable as it is not known of any additional vaccines that may be required.
