11 RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT; INCLUDING PUBLIC SAFETY
12 TELECOMMUNICATORS AS POLICE MEMBERS UNDER THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES
13 RETIREMENT ACT; PROVIDING FOR ELECTIONS PERTAINING TO THE
14 ADOPTION OF THE POLICE MEMBER COVERAGE PLANS FOR CURRENT PUBLIC
15 SAFETY TELECOMMUNICATORS.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

18 SECTION 1. Section 10-11-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1987,
19 Chapter 253, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:

20 "10-11-2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Public Employees
21 Retirement Act:

22 A. "accumulated member contributions" means the
23 amounts deducted from the salary of a member and credited to
24 the member's individual account, together with interest, if
25 any, credited to that account;

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1 B. "affiliated public employer" means the state and
2 any public employer affiliated with the association as provided
3 in the Public Employees Retirement Act, but does not include an
4 employer pursuant to the Magistrate Retirement Act, the
5 Judicial Retirement Act or the Educational Retirement Act;

6 C. "association" means the public employees
7 retirement association established under the Public Employees
8 Retirement Act;

9 D. "coverage plan funded ratio" means the ratio of
10 the actuarial value of the assets of a coverage plan to the
11 actuarial accrued liability of the association for payments
12 from the coverage plan, as determined by the association's
13 actuaries;

14 E. "disability retired member" means a retired
15 member who is receiving a pension pursuant to the disability
16 retirement provisions of the Public Employees Retirement Act;

17 F. "disability retirement pension" means the
18 pension paid pursuant to the disability retirement provisions
19 of the Public Employees Retirement Act;

20 G. "educational retirement system" means that
21 retirement system provided for in the Educational Retirement
22 Act;

23 H. "employee" means any employee of an affiliated
24 public employer;

25 I. "federal social security program" means that

1 program or those programs created and administered pursuant to
2 the act of congress approved August 14, 1935, Chapter 531, 49
3 Stat. 620, as that act may be amended;

4 J. "final average salary" means the final average
5 salary calculated in accordance with the provisions of the
6 applicable coverage plan;

7 K. "form of payment" means the applicable form of
8 payment of a pension provided for in Section 10-11-117 NMSA
9 1978;

10 L. "former member" means a person who was
11 previously employed by an affiliated public employer, who has
12 terminated that employment and who has received a refund of
13 member contributions;

14 M. "fund" means the funds included under the Public
15 Employees Retirement Act;

16 N. "member" means a currently employed,
17 contributing employee of an affiliated public employer, or a
18 person who has been but is not currently employed by an
19 affiliated public employer, who has not retired and who has not
20 received a refund of member contributions; "member" also
21 includes the following:

22 (1) "adult correctional officer member" means
23 a member who is employed as an adult correctional officer or an
24 adult correctional officer specialist by a state correctional
25 facility of the corrections department or its successor agency;

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1 (2) "adult probation and parole officer
2 member" means a member who is employed as a probation and
3 parole officer by the corrections department or its successor
4 agency;

5 (3) "juvenile correctional officer member"
6 means a member who is employed as a juvenile correctional
7 officer by the children, youth and families department or its
8 successor agency;

9 (4) "juvenile probation and parole officer
10 member" means a member who is employed as a probation and
11 parole officer by the children, youth and families department
12 or its successor agency;

13 (5) "municipal detention officer member" means
14 a member who is employed by an affiliated public employer other
15 than the state and who has inmate custodial responsibilities at
16 a facility used for the confinement of persons charged with or
17 convicted of a violation of a law or ordinance;

18 (6) "municipal fire member" means any member
19 who is employed as a full-time nonvolunteer firefighter by an
20 affiliated public employer, other than the state, and who has
21 taken the oath prescribed for firefighters;

22 (7) "municipal police member" means any member
23 who is employed as a:

24 (a) police officer by an affiliated
25 public employer, other than the state, and who has taken the

1 oath prescribed for police officers; or

2 (b) public safety telecommunicator by an
3 affiliated public employer other than the state;

4 (8) "state fire member" means any member who
5 is employed as a nonvolunteer firefighter of the state and who
6 has taken the oath prescribed for firefighters; and

7 (9) "state police member" means a member who
8 is:

9 (a) an officer of the New Mexico state
10 police division and who has taken the oath prescribed for such
11 officers and shall include a member who is an officer of the
12 New Mexico state police division and who was certified and
13 commissioned in the former motor transportation division or the
14 former special investigations division of the department of
15 public safety; or

16 (b) a public safety telecommunicator
17 employed by the state;

18 O. "membership" means membership in the
19 association;

20 P. "pension" means a series of monthly payments to
21 a retired member or survivor beneficiary as provided in the
22 Public Employees Retirement Act;

23 Q. "public employer" means the state, any
24 municipality, city, county, metropolitan arroyo flood control
25 authority, economic development district, regional housing

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1 authority, soil and water conservation district, entity created
2 pursuant to a joint powers agreement, council of government,
3 conservancy district, irrigation district, water and sanitation
4 district, water district and metropolitan water board,
5 including the boards, departments, bureaus and agencies of a
6 public employer, so long as these entities fall within the
7 meaning of governmental plan as that term is used in Section
8 414(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;

9 R. "refund beneficiary" means a supplemental needs
10 trust or a natural person designated by the member, in writing,
11 in the form prescribed by the association, as the trust or
12 person that would be refunded the member's accumulated member
13 contributions payable if the member dies and no survivor
14 pension is payable or that would receive the difference between
15 pension paid and accumulated member contributions if the
16 retired member dies before receiving in pension payments the
17 amount of the accumulated member contributions;

18 S. "retire" means to:

19 (1) terminate employment with all employers
20 covered by any state system or the educational retirement
21 system; and

22 (2) receive a pension from a state system or
23 the educational retirement system;

24 T. "retired member" means a person who has met all
25 requirements for retirement and who is receiving a pension from

1 the fund;

2 U. "retirement board" means the retirement board
3 provided for in the Public Employees Retirement Act;

4 V. "salary" means the base salary or wages paid a
5 member, including longevity pay, for personal services rendered
6 an affiliated public employer. "Salary" shall not include
7 overtime pay, unless the overtime payment is required for a
8 regular scheduled tour of duty as set forth in Section 207(k)
9 of Title 29 of the United States Code and is made on the
10 regular payroll for the period represented by that payment,
11 allowances for housing, clothing, equipment or travel, payments
12 for unused sick leave, unless the unused sick leave payment is
13 made through continuation of the member on the regular payroll
14 for the period represented by that payment, and any other form
15 of remuneration not specifically designated by law as included
16 in salary for Public Employees Retirement Act purposes. Salary
17 in excess of the limitations set forth in Section 401(a)(17) of
18 the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, shall be
19 disregarded. The limitation on compensation for eligible
20 employees shall not be less than the amount that was allowed to
21 be taken into account under the state retirement system acts in
22 effect on July 1, 1993. For purposes of this subsection,
23 "eligible employee" means an individual who was a member of a
24 state system before the first plan year beginning after
25 December 31, 1995;

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1 W. "state system" means the retirement programs
2 provided for in the Public Employees Retirement Act, the
3 Magistrate Retirement Act and the Judicial Retirement Act;

4 X. "state retirement system acts" means
5 collectively the Public Employees Retirement Act, the
6 Magistrate Retirement Act, the Judicial Retirement Act and the
7 Volunteer Firefighters Retirement Act;

8 Y. "supplemental needs trust" means a valid third-
9 party irrevocable trust that is authorized by the federal
10 Social Security Act, as amended, for the sole benefit and
11 lifetime of a trust beneficiary who is disabled and is created
12 for the purpose of providing, accounting for or receiving
13 supplemental assets that do not supplant, impair or diminish
14 any benefits or assistance of any federal, state or other
15 government entity for which the beneficiary would otherwise be
16 eligible; and

17 Z. "survivor beneficiary" means a supplemental
18 needs trust or a natural person that receives a pension or that
19 has been designated to be paid a pension as a result of the
20 death of a member or retired member."

21 SECTION 2. TEMPORARY PROVISION--MUNICIPAL POLICE MEMBER
22 COVERAGE PLAN 5--PUBLIC SAFETY TELECOMMUNICATORS--ELECTION.--On
23 or before December 30, 2026, the retirement board provided for
24 in the Public Employees Retirement Act shall conduct an
25 election to submit to municipal police members currently

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1 contributing under a municipal general member coverage plan the
2 question of adopting municipal police member coverage plan 5.
3 The election shall be conducted in accordance with procedures
4 adopted by the retirement board, and the retirement board shall
5 certify the results of the election to the secretary of state
6 on or before January 1, 2027.

7 **SECTION 3. TEMPORARY PROVISION--STATE PUBLIC SAFETY**
8 **MEMBER COVERAGE PLAN 1--PUBLIC SAFETY TELECOMMUNICATORS--**
9 **ELECTION.--**On or before December 30, 2026, the retirement board
10 provided for in the Public Employees Retirement Act shall
11 conduct an election to submit to state police members currently
12 contributing under state general member coverage plan 3 the
13 question of adopting state public safety member coverage plan
14 1. The election shall be conducted in accordance with
15 procedures adopted by the retirement board, and the retirement
16 board shall certify the results of the election to the
17 secretary of state on or before January 1, 2027.
