17	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
18	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
19	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
20	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding one million three
21	hundred thousand dollars (\$1,300,000) when the department of
22	environment certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds.
23	The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale
24	of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner
25	possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been

1 developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. 2 The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps 3 necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as 4 5 amended. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are 6 appropriated to the department of environment for the purpose of designing, inspecting and constructing wastewater system 7 improvements at the Santa Teresa border station located in Dona 8 9 Ana county. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at 10 the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the severance tax If the department of environment has not 11 bonding fund. 12 certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of 13 fiscal year 1998, the authorization provided in this section 14 shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
