AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR CERTAIN CAPITAL PROJECTS IN LAS VEGAS LOCATED IN SAN MIGUEL COUNTY; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--AUTHORIZATIONS--APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts authorized for purposes specified in Sections 2 through 4 of this act. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the

project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated for the purposes specified in Sections 2 through 4 of this act.

- B. The agencies named in Sections 2 through 4 of this act shall certify to the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this act.
- C. If the specified agency has not certified the need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1998, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.
- D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to Sections 2 through 4 of this act at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund.

Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the department of environment that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the department of environment for the

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following purposes:

A. three million two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$3,250,000) to expand the Las Vegas water treatment facility located in San Miguel county; and

B. one million five hundred sixty thousand dollars (\$1,560,000) to redesign and construct phase II of the effluent line from the wastewater treatment facility to Mills avenue in Las Vegas located in San Miguel county.

Section 3. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the local government division of the department of finance and administration that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the local government division of the department of finance and administration for the following purposes:

A. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) to purchase fire equipment and vehicles for the Las Vegas fire department located in San Miguel county;

B. two million one hundred ninety-eight thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,198,500) to complete phase II of the construction of the recreation and community center in Las Vegas located in San Miguel county;

C. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to complete the community master plan for the city of Las Vegas

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located in San Miguel county; and

thirty-six thousand dollars (\$36,000) to expand the welcome center in Las Vegas located in San Miguel county.

SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE HIGHWAY AND Section 4. TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT--PURPOSE. --Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the state highway and transportation department that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, eight hundred eight thousand five hundred dollars (\$808,500) is appropriated to the state highway and transportation department for the purpose of making street improvements to Second street and the housing area in Las Vegas located in San Miguel county.

EMERGENCY. -- It is necessary for the public Section 5. peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
