#### SENATE BILL 378

#### AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR ACTIVITIES COMMEMORATING THE FOUNDING OF NEW MEXICO TO BE CELEBRATED IN THE CITY OF ALBUQUERQUE LOCATED IN BERNALILLO COUNTY; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. APPROPRIATION.--Three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the office of cultural affairs for expenditure in fiscal years 1996 and 1997 for the purpose of commemorating the founding of New Mexico, seven years before Jamestown and twenty-two years before Plymouth. The cuartocentennial, 1598-1998, will memorialize the forming of the first continuous settlement composed of people from the old world and the new world within the boundaries of the continental United States. The descendants of the first

Americans are still living where they were joined by the second Americans that memorable day on the eleventh of August 1598 at Okhe pueblo, which is called San Juan pueblo today. unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1997 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 2. EMERGENCY. -- It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
