16	WHEREAS, human immunodeficiency virus (HIV)-related illness
17	is the leading cause of death among young adults twenty-five to
18	forty-four years old; and
19	WHEREAS, nearly one-half million Americans have AIDS, and
20	approximately forty thousand new HIV infections occur each year
21	in the United States; and
22	WHEREAS, over one thousand two hundred New Mexicans have
23	AIDS, and estimates are that at least twice that many
24	individuals have been infected with the HIV virus; and
25	WHEREAS, the second community-defined need for HIV services

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in New Mexico, as determined by the HIV coordinating council for the state, is professional education; and

WHEREAS, from the perspective of many of New Mexico's smaller communities, New Mexicans continue to face unlawful discrimination by health care providers, including circumstances in which such professionals, on the basis of an individual's being HIV seropositive, decline to provide services ordinarily offered within the scope of the professional's practice and instead refer the individual to another comparable provider or provide a different level of care to the individual; and

WHEREAS, federal and state laws exist to protect and promote the human and civil rights of people with disabilities, including people with HIV or AIDS;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of health create a task force to study mandatory training of and education for health care providers concerning HIV or AIDS and other infectious diseases and applicable laws; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be headed by the department of health and be comprised of representatives from the New Mexico medical society, board of medical examiners, New Mexico board of dental health care, New Mexico state board of nursing, New Mexico nurses association, New Mexico AIDS education and training center, HIV coordinating council, protection and advocacy system and consumers; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force report its findings to the governor and the appropriate legislative interim committee by December 1996; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the following entities: the regulation and licensing department, secretary of health, New Mexico medical society, board of medical examiners, New Mexico board of dental health care, New Mexico state board of nursing, New Mexico nurses association, protection and advocacy system and HIV coordinating council. - 3 -. 110421. 1
