AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMES; DEFINING UNLAWFUL CARRYING OF A DEADLY WEAPON ON STATE PREMISES; PROVIDING A PENALTY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new Section 30-7-2.4 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

"30-7-2.4. [NEW MATERIAL] UNLAWFUL CARRYING OF A DEADLY WEAPON ON STATE PREMISES. --

A. Unlawful carrying of a deadly weapon on state premises consists of carrying a deadly weapon on state premises by a person other than:

- (1) a peace officer;
- (2) private security personnel hired by or under contract with the state to provide armed security; or
- (3) a person older than nineteen years of age

1 in a private automobile or other private means of conveyance for  
2 lawful protection of the person's or another's person or  
3 property.

4 B. As used in this section:

5 (1) "state" means the state of New Mexico and  
6 any of its branches, agencies, departments, boards, commissions,  
7 instrumentalities and institutions, including higher education  
8 institutions; and

9 (2) "state premises" means the buildings,  
10 together with grounds and parking areas, in or on which state  
11 activities are regularly conducted under the supervision of  
12 state management personnel.

13 C. Whoever commits unlawful carrying of a deadly  
14 weapon on state premises is guilty of a fourth degree felony."
