## SENATE BILL 22

43RD LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - FIRST SESSION, 1997

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AN ACT

RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE; ESTABLISHING THE DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OVERSIGHT TASK FORCE; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OVERSIGHT TASK FORCE CREATED--TERMINATION.--The "domestic violence oversight task force" is created. The task force shall function from the date of its appointment until the first day of December prior to the second session of the forty-fourth legislature.

MEMBERSHI P-- APPOI NTMENT-- VACANCI ES. --Section 2.

- The domestic violence oversight task force shall be composed of ten legislative members, six public members and nine advisory members from the executive and judicial branches of government.
  - Five members of the house of representatives

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shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and five members of the senate shall be appointed by the committees' committee of the senate, or, if the senate appointments are made in the interim, by the president pro tempore of the senate after consultation and with the agreement of a majority of the members of the committees' committee. Members shall be appointed from each house so as to give the two major political parties in each house the same proportional representation on the task force as prevails in each house; however, in no event shall either party have less than one member from each house on the task force. Vacancies on the task force shall be filled by appointment in the same manner as the original appointments.

- C. Three public members shall be appointed to the task force by the speaker of the house of representatives, and three public members shall be appointed by the president protempore of the senate so as to represent the state's ethnic and geographic diversity. The public members of the task force shall be paid per diem and mileage in accordance with the provisions of the Per Diem and Mileage Act plus reimbursement for reasonable actual expenses.
- D. Additionally the task force shall include the following advisory members:
  - (1) the attorney general or his designee;
  - (2) the secretary of health or his designee;

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- (3) the chief justice of the supreme court or his designee;
- (4) the president of the district judges association or his designee;
- (5) the president of the magistrate judges association or his designee;
- (6) the president of the municipal judges association or his designee;
- (7) the chief judge of the Bernalillo county metropolitan court or his designee;
  - (8) the chief public defender; and
- (9) one district attorney appointed by the president of the district attorneys' association.
- E. The speaker of the house of representatives and the president pro tempore of the senate shall each designate one co-chairman of the task force.

## Section 3. DUTIES. --

- A. After its appointment, the domestic violence oversight task force shall hold one organizational meeting to develop a work plan and budget for the ensuing interim. The work plan and budget shall be submitted to the legislative council for approval.
- B. Upon approval of the work plan and budget by the legislative council, the task force shall review the adequacy of the following programs and services as they relate to domestic

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vi ol ence, including:

- (1) law enforcement needs and training;
- (2) judicial needs and training;
- (3) state- and community-based domestic violence prevention programs and services; and
- (4) alcohol and drug abuse education, prevention, screening and treatment.
- C. The task force shall recommend legislation or budget changes if any are found to be necessary to the legislature.

Section 4. REPORT.--The domestic violence oversight task force shall make a report of its findings and recommendations for the consideration of the second session of the forty-third legislature, the first session of the forty-fourth legislature and the second session of the forty-fourth legislature. The reports and suggested legislation shall be made available to the legislative council on or before December 15 preceding each session.

Section 5. STAFF.--The staff for the domestic violence oversight task force shall be provided by the legislative council service.

Section 6. APPROPRIATION. -- Forty-nine thousand five hundred dollars (\$49,500) is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative council service for expenditure in fiscal year 1998 for the purpose of paying the salaries and expenses of

technical, legal and clerical staff; for purchasing equipment and supplies; and for reimbursing the per diem and mileage expenses of the domestic violence oversight task force members. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 1997.

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
