16	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
17	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
18	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
19	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding eight hundred
20	thousand dollars (\$800,000) when the local government division
21	of the department of finance and administration certifies the
22	need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance
23	shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most
24	expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the
25	board that the project has been developed sufficiently to

1 justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance 2 shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply 3 with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The 4 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the 5 6 local government division for the purpose of constructing a county health facility located in San Miguel county to 7 accommodate the increase in staff and clients and to meet 8 9 federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 requirements. 10 Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. 11 12 If the local government division has not certified the need for 13 the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the 14 authorization provided in this section shall be void. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public 15 Section 2. 16 peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
