17	Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDSPURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED
18	APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDSThe state board of finance may issue
19	and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance
20	Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding one hundred seventy
21	thousand dollars (\$170,000) when the local government division
22	of the department of finance and administration certifies the
23	need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance
24	shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most
25	expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the

1 board that the project has been developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can proceed to 2 contract within a reasonable time. The state board of finance 3 shall further take the appropriate steps necessary to comply 4 with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. 5 The 6 proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated to the local government division for the purpose of renovating the town 7 hall in the town of Vaughn located in Guadalupe county. 8 Any 9 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of 10 fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund. If the local government division has not certified the need for 11 12 the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the 13 authorization provided in this section shall be void.

Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
