AN ACT

RELATING TO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR A  
RETAILER TO SELL A KEG OF BEER FOR CONSUMPTION OFF THE LICENSED  
PREMISES; PROVIDING PENALTIES; REPEALING AND ENACTING SECTIONS  
OF THE LIQUOR CONTROL ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Liquor Control Act is  
enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] SALE OF KEGS OF BEER PROHIBITED.--It is a  
violation of the Liquor Control Act for a retailer to sell a keg  
of beer for consumption off the licensed premises. As used in  
this section, "keg" means a package of beer containing more than  
six gallons of beer at the time it is sold."

Section 2. REPEAL.--Section 60-7B-12 NMSA 1978 (being Laws  
1989, Chapter 140, Section 1) is repealed.
