AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYEE BARGAINING; CLARIFYING THAT CERTAIN
STATE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS MAY CREATE LOCAL BOARDS; AMENDING
A SECTION OF THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEE BARGAINING ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 10-7D-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1992,
Chapter 9, Section 4) is amended to read:

"10-7D-4. DEFINITIONS. --As used in the Public Employee
Bargaining Act:

A. "appropriate bargaining unit" means a group of
public employees designated by the board or local board for the
purpose of collective bargaining;

B. "appropriate governing body" means the
policymaking body or individual representing a public employer
as defined in Section ~~[7 of the Public Employee Bargaining Act]~~

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10-7D-7 NMSA 1978;

C. "board" means the public employee labor relations board;

D. "certification" means the designation by the board or local board of a labor organization as the exclusive representative for all public employees in an appropriate bargaining unit;

E. "collective bargaining" means the act of negotiating between a public employer and an exclusive representative for the purpose of entering into a written agreement regarding wages, hours and other terms and conditions of employment;

F. "confidential employee" means a person who assists and acts in a confidential capacity with respect to a person who formulates, determines and effectuates management policies;

G. "exclusive representative" means a labor organization that, as a result of certification, has the right to represent all public employees in an appropriate bargaining unit for the purposes of collective bargaining;

H. "factfinding" means the procedure following mediation whereby the parties involved in an impasse submit their differences to a third party for an advisory recommendation;

I. "impasse" means failure of a public employer and

2 reach agreement in the course of negotiating a collective
3 bargaining agreement;

4 J. "labor organization" means any employee
5 organization, one of whose purposes is the representation of
6 public employees in collective bargaining and in otherwise
7 meeting, consulting and conferring with employers on matters
8 pertaining to employment relations;

9 K. "local board" means a local labor relations board
10 established by a public employer, other than the state, through
11 ordinance, resolution or charter amendment;

12 L. "lockout" means an act by a public employer to
13 prevent its employees from going to work and undertaken for the
14 purpose of resisting the demands of the employees' exclusive
15 representative or for the purpose of gaining a concession from
16 the exclusive representative;

17 M. "management employee" means an employee who is
18 engaged primarily in executive and management functions and is
19 charged with the responsibility of developing, administering or
20 effectuating management policies. An employee shall not be
21 deemed a management employee solely because the employee
22 participates in cooperative decision-making programs on an
23 occasional basis;

24 N. "mediation" means assistance by an impartial
25 third party to resolve an impasse between a public employer and

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1 an exclusive representative regarding employment relations
2 through interpretation, suggestion and advice;

3 0. "professional employee" means an employee whose
4 work is predominantly intellectual and varied in character and
5 whose work involves the consistent exercise of discretion and
6 judgment in its performance and requires knowledge of an
7 advanced nature in a field of learning customarily requiring
8 specialized study at an institution of higher education or its
9 equivalent. The work of a professional employee is of such
10 character that the output or result accomplished cannot be
11 standardized in relation to a given period of time;

12 P. "public employee" means a regular,
13 nonprobationary employee of a public employer; provided that in
14 the public schools, "public employee" shall also include any
15 regular probationary employee;

16 Q. "public employer" means the state or any
17 political subdivision thereof, including municipalities having
18 adopted home rule charters, and does not include any government
19 of a tribe or pueblo. State educational institutions, as
20 provided in Article 12, Section 11 of the constitution of New
21 Mexico, shall be considered public employers other than the
22 state;

23 R. "strike" means a public employee's refusal, in
24 concerted action with other public employees, to report for duty
25 or his willful absence in whole or in part from the full,

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1 faithful and proper performance of the duties of employment for
2 the purpose of inducing, influencing or coercing a change in the
3 conditions, compensation, rights, privileges or obligations of
4 public employment; and

5 S. "supervisor" means an employee who devotes a
6 substantial amount of work time to supervisory duties, who
7 customarily and regularly directs the work of two or more other
8 employees and who has the authority in the interest of the
9 employer to hire, promote or discipline other employees or to
10 recommend such actions effectively, but does not include
11 individuals who perform merely routine, incidental or clerical
12 duties or who occasionally assume supervisory or directory roles
13 or whose duties are substantially similar to those of their
14 subordinates and does not include lead employees or employees
15 who participate in peer review or occasional employee evaluation
16 programs. "
