AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS TO PAVE THE ROAD BETWEEN THE TSA-YA-TOH CHAPTER HOUSE AND BLACK HAT AT COUNTY ROAD 264 IN MCKINLEY COUNTY; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--PURPOSE FOR WHICH ISSUED-- APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) when the state highway and transportation department certifies the need for the issuance of the bonds. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been

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1 developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the  
2 project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The  
3 state board of finance shall further take the appropriate steps  
4 necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as  
5 amended. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are  
6 appropriated to the state highway and transportation department  
7 for the purpose of paving the road between the Tsa-Ya-Toh  
8 chapter house and Black Hat at county road 264 located in  
9 McKinley county. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance  
10 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2000 shall revert to the  
11 severance tax bonding fund. If the state highway and  
12 transportation department has not certified the need for the  
13 issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year 1999, the  
14 authorization provided in this section shall be void.

15 Section 2. EMERGENCY. --It is necessary for the public  
16 peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
