A J OINT MEMORIAL
REQUESTING THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EDUCATION TO STUDY THE BENEFITS OF MULTITRACK, YEAR-ROUND EDUCATION.

WHEREAS, a multitrack, year-round school is defined as one that operates on at least three tracks, with one track not in attendance while the other tracks are in attendance, and one in which the operation of the school has increased the enrollment capacity of the school; and

WHEREAS, multitrack, year-round education provides calendar, curricula and family options that fit changing I ifestyles, work patterns and community involvement for large segments of the population; and

WHEREAS, instituting multitrack, year-round education is one way to reduce overcrowding in school districts; and

WHEREAS, research indicates that limited-English-proficient

students benefit from year-round education because students demonstrably retain more information under a system of shorter, more frequent breaks in the school year than they do by being out of school for a three-month period during the summer; and WHEREAS, research indicates that disadvantaged students, especially, lose ground during this period; and

WHEREAS, multitrack, year-round education has been associated with capital outlay cost savings, more efficient use of instructional materials, reduced student absenteeism, reduced teacher absenteeism and reduction in vandalism, burglary and graffiti; and

WHEREAS, a use of a multitrack, year-round calendar may increase a school's census by twenty-five percent to fifty percent; and

WHEREAS, the process used to determine the costeffectiveness of a multitrack, year-round education plan is complex and problematic;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE I T RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the state department of public education, in cooperation with the legislative education study committee, be requested to study the benefits of multitrack, year-round education; and

BE I T FURTHER RESOLVED that the study include whether the costs of operating a multitrack, year-round calendar are more than those of operating schools on a traditional calendar and,
if so, whether the additional costs warrant the institution of a
weighting factor in the public school funding formula; and
BE I T FURTHER RESOLVED that the study and recommendations
be reported to the I egislative education study committee by
November 1, 1997; and
BE I T FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be
transmitted to the superintendent of public instruction and the
director of the Iegislative education study committee staff for
appropriate distribution.
