AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS; REAUTHORIZING UNEXPENDED OR UNENCUMBERED BALANCES; CHANGING AGENCIES AND PURPOSES OF CERTAIN BOND AUTHORIZATIONS AND FUND APPROPRIATIONS; EXTENDING EXPENDITURE PERIODS; AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS-- AUTHORIZATIONS-- APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS. --

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts authorized for purposes specified in this act. The state board of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most expeditious and economical manner

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1 possible upon a finding by the board that the project has been
2 developed sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the
3 project can proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The
4 state board of finance shall further take the appropriate
5 steps necessary to comply with the Internal Revenue Code of
6 1986, as amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are
7 appropriated for the purposes specified in this act.

8 B. The agencies named in this act shall certify to
9 the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of
10 the severance tax bonds authorized in this section is needed
11 for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this
12 act.

13 C. If the specified agency has not certified the
14 need for the issuance of the bonds by the end of fiscal year
15 2000, the authorization provided in this act shall be void.

16 D. Unless otherwise specified in this act, any
17 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining from the proceeds
18 of severance tax bonds issued pursuant to this act at the end
19 of fiscal year 2002 shall revert to the severance tax bonding
20 fund.

21 Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE AGENCY ON AGING--
22 PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this
23 act, upon certification by the state agency on aging that the
24 need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following
25 amounts are appropriated to the state agency on aging for the

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1 following purposes:

2 A. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the
3 purpose of planning, designing or constructing a senior
4 citizen center for the community of Truchas located in Rio
5 Arriba county; and

6 B. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to fund phase
7 three of construction of the Santa Clara senior citizen and
8 community center of the pueblo of Santa Clara in Rio Arriba
9 county.

10 Section 3. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--STATE ARMORY BOARD--
11 PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this
12 act, upon certification by the state armory board that the
13 need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following
14 amounts are appropriated to the state armory board for the
15 following purposes:

16 A. four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) to
17 plan, design and construct an armory near Clayton in Union
18 county; and

19 B. seven hundred forty-four thousand five hundred
20 dollars (\$744,500) to renovate, repair or make improvements to
21 various armories located throughout the state.

22 Section 4. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--OFFICE OF CULTURAL
23 AFFAIRS--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of
24 this act, upon certification by the office of cultural affairs
25 that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, the

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1 following amounts are appropriated to the office of cultural
2 affairs for the following purposes:

3 A. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the
4 purpose of planning, designing or preparing bids for a new
5 museo cultural in the city of Santa Fe located in Santa Fe
6 county;

7 B. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for the
8 purpose of equipping a newly constructed library at the pueblo
9 of Cochiti located in Sandoval county;

10 C. one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars
11 (\$125,000) for the purpose of re-roofing the Clyde Tombaugh
12 space theater and planetarium at the space center in
13 Alamogordo located in Otero county;

14 D. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000)
15 for the purpose of planning or designing an addition to the
16 palace of the governors state history museum located in Santa
17 Fe county;

18 E. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the
19 purpose of installing a heating and ventilation air
20 conditioning control system in the space center in Alamogordo
21 located in Otero county;

22 F. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the
23 purpose of designing, constructing, furnishing or equipping a
24 new pavilion, greenhouse and science theater at the New Mexico
25 museum of natural history and science in Albuquerque located

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1 in Bernalillo county;

2 G. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) to
3 renovate, repair or make improvements to state museums and
4 facilities located throughout the state; and

5 H. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
6 design, develop, construct or equip permanent exhibits at the
7 New Mexico farm and ranch heritage museum in Dona Ana county.

8 Section 5. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--CUMBRES AND TOLTEC
9 SCENIC RAILROAD COMMISSION--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the
10 provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the
11 Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad commission that the need
12 exists for the issuance of the bonds, fifty thousand dollars
13 (\$50,000) is appropriated to the Cumbres and Toltec scenic
14 railroad commission to renovate, in order to comply with the
15 provisions of the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of
16 1990, the Chama engine house, the Osier facility or the
17 Antonito depot of the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad
18 located in Rio Arriba county.

19 Section 6. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
20 DEPARTMENT--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
21 of this act, upon certification by the state housing authority
22 of the economic development department that the need exists
23 for the issuance of the bonds, one hundred thousand dollars
24 (\$100,000) is appropriated to the state housing authority of
25 the economic development department to plan, design, construct

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1 or equip a child-care training center to be located within a
2 one-hundred-twenty-unit affordable housing project in the city
3 of Santa Fe in Santa Fe county.

4 Section 7. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--ENERGY, MINERALS AND
5 NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the
6 provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the
7 energy, minerals and natural resources department that the
8 need exists for the issuance of the bonds, five hundred
9 thousand dollars (\$500,000) is appropriated to the energy,
10 minerals and natural resources department for the purpose of
11 planning, designing, renovating and making improvements to
12 forestry headquarter facilities and other facilities
13 throughout the state.

14 Section 8. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--OFFICE OF THE STATE
15 ENGINEER--PURPOSE.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of
16 this act, upon certification by the office of the state
17 engineer that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds,
18 fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated to the office
19 of the state engineer for the purpose of designing,
20 constructing, purchasing or installing siphons for acequias
21 near Hernandez located in Rio Arriba county.

22 Section 9. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--DEPARTMENT OF
23 ENVIRONMENT--PURPOSES.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section
24 1 of this act, upon certification by the department of
25 environment that the need exists for the issuance of the

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1 bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the
2 department of environment for the following purposes:

3 A. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for
4 improvements to the Lone Mountain and Twin Sisters wellfields
5 in the village of Santa Clara in Grant county;

6 B. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the
7 acquisition or installation of a water tank or the
8 construction or installation of approximately ten thousand
9 linear feet of transmission pipeline to connect to the
10 existing water system in Corona in Lincoln county;

11 C. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the
12 purpose of surveying a well location, drilling or equipping
13 wells, purchasing or replacing storage tanks and valves or for
14 engineering or other studies to improve the Lincoln mutual
15 domestic water and sewage association water system located in
16 Lincoln county;

17 D. seventy-eight thousand dollars (\$78,000) for
18 the purpose of making improvements to the Bibo community water
19 system located in Cibola county;

20 E. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for
21 planning, designing, constructing or equipping a water and
22 wastewater system in the town of Springer in Colfax county;

25 water filtration system, for the community of Miami in Colfax

22 administration that the need exists for the issuance of the
23 bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the local
24 government division of the department of finance and
25 administration for the following purposes:
