AN ACT

CREATING A JOINT INTERIM LEGISLATIVE SUBDIVISION IMPACT REVIEW
COMMITTEE; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. SUBDIVISION IMPACT REVIEW COMMITTEE CREATED--
TERMINATION.--The "subdivision impact review committee" is
created as a joint interim legislative committee. The
committee shall function from the date of its appointment
until December 1 prior to the first session of the forty-
fourth legislature.

Section 2. MEMBERSHIP-- APPOINTMENT-- VACANCIES.--

A. The subdivision impact review committee shall
be composed of eight members. The New Mexico legislative
council shall appoint four members from the house of
representatives and four members from the senate. At the time

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1 of making the appointment, the legislative council shall
2 designate the chairman and vice chairman of the committee.

3 B. Members shall be appointed from each house so
4 as to give the two major political parties in each house the
5 same proportionate representation on the subdivision impact
6 review committee as prevails in each house; however, in no
7 event shall either party have less than one member from each
8 house on the committee. At the request of the committee
9 chairman, members may be removed from the committee by the New
10 Mexico legislative council for nonattendance according to
11 council policy. Vacancies on the committee, however caused,
12 may be filled by the legislative council, or the council may
13 reduce the size of the committee by not making replacement
14 appointments and in such case need not readjust party
15 representation.

16 C. No action shall be taken by the subdivision
17 impact review committee if a majority of the total membership
18 from either house on the committee rejects such action.

19 Section 3. DUTIES.--After its appointment, the
20 subdivision impact review committee shall hold one
21 organizational meeting to develop a work plan and budget for
22 the ensuing interim. The work plan and budget shall be
23 submitted to the New Mexico legislative council for approval.
24 Upon approval of the work plan and budget by the legislative
25 council, the committee shall examine the statutes,

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1 constitutional provisions, regulations and court decisions
2 governing subdivision in New Mexico and recommend legislation
3 or changes if any are found to be necessary to the first
4 session of the forty-fourth legislature.

5 Section 4. SUBCOMMITTEES. -- Subcommittees shall be
6 created only by majority vote of all members appointed to the
7 subdivision impact review committee and with the prior
8 approval of the New Mexico legislative council. A
9 subcommittee shall be composed of at least one member from the
10 senate and one member from the house of representatives, and
11 at least one member of the minority party shall be a member of
12 the subcommittee. All meetings and expenditures of a
13 subcommittee shall be approved by the full committee in
14 advance of such meeting or expenditure, and the approval shall
15 be shown in the minutes of the committee.

16 Section 5. REPORT. -- The subdivision impact review
17 committee shall make a report of its findings and
18 recommendations for the consideration of the first session of
19 the forty-fourth legislature. The report and suggested
20 legislation shall be made available to the New Mexico
21 legislative council on or before December 15 preceding that
22 session.

23 Section 6. STAFF. -- The staff for the subdivision impact
24 review committee shall be provided by the legislative council
25 service.

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1 Section 7. APPROPRIATION.--Twenty thousand dollars
2 (\$20,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the
3 legislative council service for expenditure in fiscal year
4 1999 for the purpose of paying the salaries and expenses of
5 the technical, legal, clerical and stenographic assistants,
6 for necessary equipment and supplies used in carrying out the
7 provisions of this act and for reimbursing the per diem and
8 mileage expenses of the subdivision impact review committee.
9 Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of
10 fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund. Payments
11 from the appropriation shall be made upon vouchers signed by
12 the director of the legislative council service or his
13 authorized representative.

14 Section 8. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public
15 peace, health and safety that this act take effect
16 immediately.
