A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO DETERMINE THE BEST METHOD OF FINANCING HIGH-RISK PATIENT TREATMENT AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER, INCLUDING THE ADEQUACY OF REIMBURSEMENT UNDER SALUD.

WHEREAS, the university of New Mexico health sciences center is the provider of last resort to certain high-risk patients and cannot limit that care; and

WHEREAS, the implementation of medicaid managed care appears to be negatively affecting both those patients and the mission of the health sciences center; and

WHEREAS, seventy-five percent of medicaid SALUD patients are enrolled in managed care organizations that are relying mainly on other health care providers for primary care services and on the health sciences center only for certain

tertiary services; and

WHEREAS, medicaid payments are not adequately adjusted to reflect the acuity and complexity of many patients served by the health sciences center, particularly behavioral health patients; and

WHEREAS, the implementation of SALUD has resulted in greater administrative burdens, less automation, delayed receipt of payments and the need for physicians to be familiar with multiple administrative systems; and

WHEREAS, without adequate financing or an increased number of patients who do not require intensive services, the mission of the health sciences center will, in the long run, be compromised;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the human services department be requested to study and determine the best method of financing high-risk patients treated by the university of New Mexico health sciences center, including the adequacy of reimbursement under SALUD; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this analysis include consideration of adjustments in reimbursement to the health sciences center if the data indicate that the current SALUD reimbursement does not cover the cost of caring for these patients; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be . 120023.1
