A MEMORIAL

SENATE MEMORIAL 12

REQUESTING THAT PURCHASE OF THE BACA LOCATION NUMBER 1 BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT BE CONTINGENT ON NO NET LOSS OF PRIVATE LANDS WITHIN THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO.

WHEREAS, the United States government owns approximately twenty-seven million acres of land within the state of New Mexico, constituting over one-third of New Mexico's total acreage; and

WHEREAS, the bureau of land management has identified approximately one million acres of land in New Mexico under its control as "surplus" and appropriate for disposal; and

WHEREAS, the United States park service and forest service have been pursuing vast land acquisition projects within the state of New Mexico for years; and

WHEREAS, the United States faces a tremendous backlog of

land acquisition projects the federal government has already committed to purchase; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico property owners are awaiting promised purchase on numerous park service and forest service projects; and

WHEREAS, further increase in the percentage of federal ownership of land within New Mexico may be detrimental to the state:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that any federal purchase of the Baca location number 1 be contingent on no net loss of private lands within the state of New Mexico, to be accomplished by means of either sale or exchange of surplus public domain lands into private ownership, in amounts equal to the acreage in the Baca purchase; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that further federal purchase of private land in New Mexico commence only subsequent to fulfillment of current federal obligation to purchase from private New Mexico landholders; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the New Mexico congressional delegation.
