11	REQUESTING THE NEW MEXICO DELEGATION TO THE UNITED STATES
12	CONGRESS TO SUPPORT STATISTICAL SAMPLING IN THE 2000 CENSUS IN
13	ORDER NOT TO UNDERCOUNT NEW MEXICO'S POPULATION.

15	WHEREAS, the United States census bureau estimates that
16	forty-eight thousand fifty-four New Mexicans went uncounted in
17	the 1990 census or about three and seven hundredths percent of
18	New Mexico's population; and
19	WHEREAS, the United States census bureau estimates that
20	American Indians on reservations were undercounted by twelve
21	and two-tenths percent and Hispanics by five percent; and
22	WHEREAS, this represents the highest undercount
23	percentage of any state and compares with a one and six-tenths
24	percent national average; and
25	WHEREAS, based on 1996 figures, the state loses about one

WHEREAS, this represents more than seventy-two million dollars (\$72,000,000) over the last decade in lost federal funds for police, water works, sewers, roads and schools; and

WHEREAS, if New Mexico experienced the same undercount in 2000, fifty-seven thousand two hundred seven people would be undercounted, which would amount to eighty-five million dollars (\$85,000,000) in lost federal funds in the following decade; and

WHEREAS, the census bureau this year proposed to use scientific sampling in the 2000 census in order to give a more accurate count of those living in rural areas and better represent American Indians living on reservations and Hispanics that the bureau says are the two most undercounted ethnic groups; and

WHEREAS, scientific sampling could save federal taxpayers up to eight hundred million dollars (\$800,000,000) on the next census; and

WHEREAS, scientific sampling has been endorsed by the national academy of sciences, the last four census directors, the general accounting office and the United States conference of mayors; and

WHEREAS, the United States justice department in the Carter, Bush and Clinton administrations concluded that the .123417.1
