15	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
16	"Private Student Tuition Scholarship Act".
17	Section 2. LEGISLATIVE INTENTThe legislature
18	recognizes that for every student eligible for public school
19	who is instead educated in a non-public school or at home, the
20	state is spared the cost of educating that student. The intent
21	of the Private Student Tuition Scholarship Act is to recognize
22	the value of the private contribution that has been made to
23	the student's education by providing the student with a
24	tuition scholarship for post-secondary education.

Tuition Scholarship Act:

2 A. "commission" means the commission on higher
3 education;

B. "eligible institution" means any public postsecondary educational institution in New Mexico;

C. "eligible student" means a New Mexico resident under the age of twenty-four who has completed one or more years of qualifying private education; and

D. "qualifying private education" means elementary or secondary education in New Mexico that occurred after July
1, 1999 at an accredited non-public school or in an approved home-school program.

Section 4. ELIGIBILITY.--An eligible student meeting entrance requirements shall be entitled to one full-year tuition scholarship to the eligible institution of the student's choice for each year of qualifying private education completed by the student at a time when the student was eligible for enrollment in public school in New Mexico. The scholarship shall continue for such time as the recipient remains a student in good standing at the institution, but in no event shall the student receive a scholarship for more than five years.

Section 5. RULES.--The commission may adopt rules necessary to implement the provisions of the Private Student Tuition Scholarship Act.
